Students must reach the school by the prescribed timings:

Kindly adhere to the dispersal timings.

Remedial classes will be held on Saturdays as per the schedule mentioned on page no. 29.

5th Saturday is a full working day.

FEE

- School fees along with the transport fees are to be paid quarterly: April to June, July to Sep., Oct. to Dec., Jan. to March.
- Fee is to be paid by cheque/online banking or cash on fee window. In case of withdrawal of a child, a month's notice in writing is to be given (on fee window) or full charges of fee voucher will be levied (Complete Quarter).
- After 20th, **a fine (amount)** will be added in the Fee Voucher. The Fee must be paid in advance by the 20th of the cited month, failing to do so a late fee of Rs. 10/- per day will be charged up to the 30th of the cited month. Thereafter, Rs. 20/- per day will be charged as a late fee up to the 20th of the following month. After that, a fine of Rs. 100/- every 15th day, will be charged up to the next quarter.
- ➤ Monthly fee (permitted students only) will be accepted only till the 5th of the cited month. School has provided you the service on special conditions, kindly respect the given time limit.
- ➤ Once the **school transport** is opted, it can be withdrawn only in case of a change of address. (if the transport is not available by the school in that area)





- > Head Boy / Head Girl and Vice Head Boy / Vice Head Girl will not be a part of any house.


